The Reas the most Reberend CHAP. Father in God, Richard Lord Arch: KLVI. Billiop of Armagh, Primate and Betropo= Preamble. litan of all Ireland, out of his generous Inclinations to the good of this Kingbom, and for the Encouragement of the liberal Arts and Sciences, bery lately at his own Coft and Charges erected and An Obserbuilt fuch Observatory and Duseum, Museum built and laid out for the present Twenty Acres by the Prince of Armagh, in Acres laid out for the said City of Armagh, in Acres laid out for the Keen-

XLVI. of the faid Observatory and Duseum, and his Successors for eber; which faid Twenty Acres are the Effate of the See of Armagh, and are now in the Poffellion of the Reverend Doctor James Archibald Hamilton, lately nominated and appointed Beeper of the faid Obferbatory and Dukerper to be feum: And whereas the faid Richard Lozd veriment of Arch-Bilhop of Armagh, intending that the Reeper of the faid Dbferbatory and Duseum Chould be under the Gobernment and Militation of the Primate for the Time being, the Reverend the Dean of Armagh for the Time being, and certain other Berfons herein after named, and their Successors, who by an Act of Parliament made in this Kingdom in the Thirteenth and fourteenth Bears of Dis prefent Bajefly's Reign, were at the Petition of the faid Richard Lord Arch= Billyop of Armagh, incorporated for the better Regulation of the Bublic Library of Armagh, then also lately erected at the Coffs of the faid Richard Lord Arch-Bi-Hop of Armagh, and for the Prefervation of the funds thereof: And whereas the faid Richard Lord Arch=Bilhop of Armagh, Did by a certain Indenture, bearing Date the fifth Day of April laft, fo far as in him lay, beit the faid Dbferbatory and Quieum, and the faid Twenty Acres of Land, and an Altronomical and Philoso= phical Apparatus, intended by the faid Lord Arch-Bishop to be deposited in and bestomen

31 th July 1790

bestowed upon the said Dbserbatory and CHAP. Museum, in the Gobernois and Guardians ,XLVI. of the faid Public Library, upon Trufts fimilar for the Regulation and Preferba= tion of the faid Dbferbatory and Bufeum, to those with which they are invested by the faid Act of Parliament, with Respect to the faid Public Library, and all Things pepolited therein; and the faid Lord Arch=Bilhop did Mortly after the Grecu= tion of the laid last mentioned Deed, nominate and appoint the Reverend Doc- appointed tor James Archibald Hamilton, the first Keeper. Reeper of the faid Dbferbatory and Du= feum: And whereas the faid Richard Lord Further En-Arch=Billiop of Armagh, doth intend fur= downents inther to Endow the faid Observatory and Primate. Buseum with Lands in fee Simple: and as it may be doubtful whether such Gift can be valid without a License to alien the same in Mortmain, at the Suit therefore of the faid Richard Lord Arch= Bilhop of Armagh, and to remove the faid Doubt and all others which might arife for want of an Incorporation of the Governors and Guardians of the faid Obler= vatory and Muleum, as well as those of the said Public Library, Be it Enacted by the King's Most Excellent Bajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament, affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said Observatory and Buleum, and the Fabricks thereof, and
