I do not know what the legal position may be with regard to lantern slides or whether you ought to get permission from the publishers of the various pictures; making slides from the pictures might be an infringement of copyright and a claim might be made on you for fees or damages. Probably Paul would be able to tell you.

I hope you got the letter I sent to you at Jerusalem; I was very glad, indeed, to hear of you and to hear all about your travels; and please give my best thanks to Lucy for her letter. Miss Abernethy has sent me the "Illustrated" with your portrait of Queen Marie — a very admirable piece of work.
