PEOPLE'S LEAGUE OF HEALTH

Forthcoming Ball at Hampstead

The Duchess of Marlborough received the guests at a the Dansant, held yesterday afternoon at Claridge's Hotel, on behalf of the Empire Ball, to be held at Viscount Leverhulme's house, "The Hill," Hampstead, on April 30th, in aid of the People's League of Health.

A special feature of the Empire Ball will be a Pageant Costume competition, in which various great characters will be represented. This competition is being organised by Mr. Sidney Bland, of His Majesty's Theatre, and the winner of the first prize will have the distinction of being painted by the famous artist, Mr. Philip de Laszlo.

Mrs. Hilton Philipson, M.P., said the importance of the work which the People's League of Health was doing in spreading the knowledge of public health, could not be over-estimated. Housing conditions, over-crowding and lack of nourishing food were only a few of the difficulties which the League had to overcome.

Dr. C. W. Saleeby said he had found no health education of the people in seven European countries, but found it well done in America with good success. He pointed out that people learnt all sorts of rubbish at school, such as geography and history which was no earthly good to them, but they were never taught how to keep physically fit. He emphasised the necessity for more sunlight, saying that open air and open spaces were needed.

Lieutenant-Colonel F. E. Fremantle, M.P., announced that the League was organising a medical conference, to be held from May 24th to May 30th at the British Empire Exhibition, Wembley.
