## General Directions

### The Pattern

#### SYMBOLS

GRAIN LINE Place on straight grain of fabric parallel to selvage

PLACE SOLID LINE on fold of fabric.

CENTER FRONT OR BACK of garment.

NOTCHES

DOTS

CUTTING LINE

LENGTHEN OR SHORTEN LINES

SEAM ALLOWANCE: 5/8" (1.5cm)

unless otherwise stated is included but not

printed on MULTI-SIZE PATTERNS.

Mark your size with colored felt tip pen.

See chart on tissue for how to use MULTI-

SIZE PATTERNS.

ADJUST IF NEEDED  
Make adjustments before placing pattern on fabric.


TO LENGTHEN: Cut pattern between lengthen or shorten lines. Spread pattern evenly, needed and tape to paper.

TO SHORTEN: At lengthen or shorten lines, make an even pleat taking up amount needed. Tape in place.

When lengthen or shorten lines are not given, make adjustments at lower edge of pattern.

#### Sewing

- SEW garment following **Sewing Directions**.
- PIN or machine-baste seams matching notches.
- STITCH 5/8" (1.5 cm) seams unless otherwise stated.
- PRESS seams open unless otherwise indicated clipping when necessary so seams will lie flat.
- TRIM seams to reduce bulk, as shown below.



### Cutting/Marking

#### BEFORE CUTTING:

PRESS pattern pieces with a warm dry iron. PRE-SHRINK fabric by pre-washing washables or steam-pressing non-washables.

CIRCLE your cutting layout.

PIN pattern to fabric as shown in Cutting Layouts.

FOR DOUBLE THICKNESS: Fold fabric with RIGHT sides together.

FOR SINGLE THICKNESS: Place fabric RIGHT side up.

FOR FOLIAGE, SHADING OR ONE WAY DESIGN FABRICS: Use "with nap" layouts

AFTER CUTTING:  
Transfer markings to WRONG side of fabric before removing pattern. Use pin or chalk method or dressmaker's tracing paper and wheel.


#### To Quick Mark:

- Snip edge of fabric to mark notches, ends of fold lines and center lines.
- Pin mark dots.



#### SPECIAL CUTTING NOTES

If layout shows a piece extending past fold, cut out all pieces except piece that extends.



Mark small arrows along both selvages indicating direction of nap or design. Fold fabric crosswise with RIGHT sides together, and cut along fold (a).

Open out fabric to single thickness. Cut extending piece on RIGHT side of fabric in position shown.



CROSSWISE FOLD SELVAGE SELVAGES

Turn one fabric layer around so arrows on both layers go in the same direction. Place RIGHT sides together (b).



## SIMPLY THE BEST SEWING TECHNIQUES FOR KNITS

- Use a ball point or stretch needle.
- Use narrow zig-zag stitch or a stretch stitch.
- To prevent shoulder seams from stretching, pin center of hem tape, clear elastic or twill tape along seam line on front shoulder edges, then stitch the shoulder seams.



## Sewing Directions

FABRIC KEY	RIGHT SIDE	WRONG SIDE	INTERFACING	LINING	LINING SIDE

Read **General Directions** on page 1 before you begin.

**EDGESEITCH** – See Machine Stitches: "how to sew an edgestitch" video.

**NARROW HEM** – See Hems: "sewing narrow hems" video.

### FOR OVERLOCK/SERGER

- The Overlock/Serger can be used alone or as a supplement to your conventional sewing machine.
- Overlock sewing machines stitch, trim and finish all in one operation. Therefore, it is VERY important to Check Fit before stitching seams.
- Using matching color thread, baste seams and try garment on. If no adjustments are needed, overlock seams along basting.
- The three thread overlock is ideal for major seams such as shoulder, side, underarm and sleeve seams.
- For stress areas such as crotch seams and armholes, the four thread overlock/safety stitch is best...OR, use a three thread overlock, and stitch along seam with a conventional machine to reinforce.
- The two or three thread overlock stitch is a perfect finish for edges of facings, hems and seam allowances.


**STITCH 5/8" (1.5CM) SEAMS WITH RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.**

### DRESS A, B

**1. NARROW HEM** long, unnotched edge and lower edge of FRONT OVERLAY (2) sections. To form a narrow hem, press under 5/8" (1.5cm) hem allowance. Tuck under raw edge to meet crease. Press. **EDGESEITCH** hem in place along inner edge.

**2. NARROW HEM** Pin RIGHT side of the UPPER BINDING (3) to the WRONG side of front overlay along upper edge with raw edges even, matching large dots. Stitch in a 3/8" (1cm) seam from side edge to large dot, back-stitching at dot to reinforce the seam.

**3. NARROW HEM** Press seam toward binding, pressing binding out. On OUTSIDE, attach a small safety pin to free end of binding, outside the seam allowance and off center.




**4.** Fold binding in half, lengthwise, with RIGHT sides together, matching large dots and sandwiching the pin. Stitch free end to large dot in a 3/8" (1cm) seam, backstitching at dot to reinforce the seam.



**5.** Draw safety pin forward, through fold, turning tie end of binding RIGHT side out. Press, pressing under remaining raw edge 3/8" (1cm). On OUTSIDE, pin pressed edge of binding over seam. **EDGESEITCH** inner edge of binding in place, continuing stitching to end of tie.

**6. NARROW HEM** lower edge of FRONT (1).

**7.** Pin WRONG side of front overlay to the RIGHT side of front, matching small dots, large dots, and notches. Baste side edges together.




8. Stitch BACK (4) together at center back edges from lower edge to large dot, backstitching at dot to reinforce the seam. Press seam open.




9. **NARROW HEM** back opening edges, squaring stitching  $1/8"$  (3mm) below large dot.

10. **NARROW HEM** lower edge of back.




11. Stitch front to back at shoulder edges, and side edges from armhole edge to large dot, backstitching at dot to reinforce the seam.


12. **NARROW HEM** side edge slit, squaring stitching  $1/8"$  (3mm) above large dot.




13. Pin **RIGHT** side of the **NECK BINDING** (5) to the **WRONG** side of front and back neck edge with raw edges even, matching centers and small dots, having inner small dots at shoulder seams. Stitch in a  $3/8"$  (1cm) seam, stretching the binding to fit.




14. Press seam toward binding, pressing binding out. On **OUTSIDE**, make thread loop  $1/8"$  (3mm) below small dot at **LEFT** back edge of binding large enough to fit button.




15. Fold ends of binding in half, lengthwise, with **RIGHT** sides together, sandwiching the thread ends of loop. Stitch binding ends to small dot in a  $5/8"$  (1.5cm) seam.




16. Turn ends of binding **RIGHT** side out. Press, pressing under remaining raw edge  $3/8"$  (1cm). On **OUTSIDE**, pin pressed edge of binding over seam. **EDGESEITCH** inner edge of binding in place. **Sew button to RIGHT back opposite loop when dress is finished.**




17. Stitch underarm edges of **SLEEVE** (6). **NARROW HEM** lower edge.



18. Turn sleeve **RIGHT** side out. Hold dress **WRONG** side out with armhole toward you. With **RIGHT** sides together, pin sleeve to armhole edge with center small dot at shoulder seam, matching underarm seams, notches and remaining small dots. Baste. Stitch. Stitch again  $1/8"$  (3mm) from first stitching. Trim seam below notches close to stitching. Press seam toward sleeve.



19. Stitch ends of **ARMHOLE BINDING** (7) together.



20. Trim  $1/4"$  (6mm) from armhole edge. Pin **RIGHT** side of the armhole binding to the **WRONG** side of front and back armhole edge with raw edges even, matching seams, placing inner small dot at shoulder seam. Stitch in a  $3/8"$  (1cm) seam, stretching the binding to fit.



21. Press seam toward binding, pressing binding out. Turn under remaining raw edge  $3/8"$  (1cm). On **OUTSIDE**, pin pressed edge of binding over seam. **EDGESEITCH** inner edge of binding in place.
